MENTAL HEALTH MINUTE

The pandemic has affected everyone in unique and varied ways. Many families have experienced financial, employment, social and health challenges. Some have experienced significant disruptions and losses. We have also all witnessed inequities. systemic prejudice and the impact of racism in our society during this time. Even as society returns to more normal social interactions, we are aware that each child will approach the new school year with many different feelings. They may be excited, or perhaps nervous and some children could be quite worried and anxious. All of these feelings and emotions are natural responses to

what our children have experienced over the past two and a half years. Check in regularly with your child, as their emotions and feelings will likely change from day to day or week to week. You can normalize any fears as a response to the uncertainty and can reassure them. Even though things are different, they can manage and there will be adults there to help. It can be helpful to remind your child of the positives of going back to school, such as seeing their friends again. Perhaps make a list together about what they are excited about. Remind your child that when school starts, they will be supported and safe.

A CHILD'S MENTAL HEALTH IS AS IMPORTANT AS THEIR PHYSICAL HEALTH AND DESERVES THE SAME QUALITY OF SUPPORT.

DRESS CODE REMINDER
