- 5.0 Principal's Report: September Principal's Report 2022
 - continually refining the communication pathway between teachers and parents via Remind, school newsletter, electronic board



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- Covid is still an issue we must be aware of. Students and staff are asked to stay home if they are feeling unwell.
- The new school construction progresses with various decisions needing to be made along the way. The general public must realize they are not able to tour the new school or the construction site.
- HAK will be hosting an information session about the importance of a school council and the role it plays in the school and community. This session will take place in October, details to come.

6.0 Trustee/ Board Highlights: Elohne Chizawsky

We had a Board Briefing on September 1st and held our Organizational meeting on September 8^{th.} Our Board has had a trustee resign due to personal reasons. We will be holding a bi-election for Ward 1 to ensure that Aspen View has representation in all Wards. Candy Nikipelo continues as our Chair as it is a 2-year appointment and we have re-elected a vice chair. The members of the Board are excited that the new school year has begun and I am very happy to say that enrollment is up in most of our Schools. HAK has 39 new students.

As many of you know Mr. Dick Richards has retired and we have a new Administrator at HAK. Mrs. Brenda Mykitiuk is HAK's new Administrator. She is happy to be back at HAK and we all look forward to an excellent school year. With Mrs. Mykitiuk taking over at HAK, Vilna school now has a new Administrator as. Mr. Joe Harrington has taken over that role. Joe has been at Vilna for many years and looks forward to his new role.

HAK is holding its pancake breakfast this Friday, September 16th at 8:30 am. Everyone is welcome. It has been a very LONG 2 ½ years without an Awards night. I am pleased to say that HAK will be holding their Awards night starting at 6:30 pm and Convocation to commence at 7:30 pm in person on September 23rd.



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I am sure that many of you have questions about the new school. Stantec tells us we are still on target and on budget. The completion date is March 31st.

We have a meeting with the Education Minister on September 30th. Our Board will be speaking to her about 2 of our major priorities. Rural transportation and the introduction of the new curriculum and recommendations on how it should be rolled out. In regard to Rural transportation-all rural divisions face many of the same problems. Insurance has jumped to over \$6200 to insure each school bus. It makes it almost impossible for private bus owners to insure more than 1 bus as some have in the past. Getting drivers is becoming more and more difficult as well. If we don't have drivers, we cannot get the students to school! And as we all know the price of fuel/diesel is atrocious. The fuel contingency put in place has helped but by no means is it an answer to our issues.

With the new curriculum, our board will discuss advocating for a "slow down" for the implementation for 2023 and how it should be rolled out. Aspen View has a new associate Superintendent, Katherine Mann who is leading the implementation, gathering, and organizing of resources for our staff. We thank our staff for starting the implementation of the new curriculum. It is not an easy task.

The amended Use of Highway and Rules of the Road Regulation will allow school buses to drive at the posted speed limit on Alberta highways, instead of at 90 km/h. Alberta was the only Canadian jurisdiction that still limited the maximum speed limit for school buses. Permitting school buses to travel at posted highway speeds will increase road safety by reducing the likelihood of drivers taking unnecessary risks to pass slower-moving school buses. This speed limit change was recommended in a report released by the Student Transportation Task Force.

A number of School Boards have advocated for this change for years. The ASBA also made a motion some time ago to have the speed limit changed. The change came into effect on Sept. 1st/22.

- Jr and Sr High options- The question was asked, how does the school pick the options available to Jr and Sr High students. The students are asked what topics they would find useful. Donna Cherniwchan mentioned enrollment has increased this year so there may be more money for funding the options. Kelly Montgomery suggested surveying the parents to see what option ideas they have for their children. Jered Serben spoke about the need to focus on practical learning for the students. There is a need in the community and the province to provide the students with useful skill sets. Here is an opportunity for HAK to provide students with learnings they will rely on. Jered Serben suggested approaching Smoky Lake County with what the learning needs are and the County will assist HAK in securing funds. I
